We will be moving to Lewes as soon as our house sells, and look forward to discovering Lewes.


Please feel free to stop by the church during the week this summer so we can get acquainted.



Drivers are needed for this caring ministry. If you feel the Lord leading you to serve in this ministry as a driver, please call the church office to add your name to the list.



#### Report from Lay Members to Annual Conference June 6, 7 & 8, 2013

The theme for this year's Annual Conference and the focus of the churches in the Pen-Del Conference this coming year is **Diversity: Embrace it! Celebrate it!** The message was that we not only welcome people of different cultures into our churches but to make their cultural differences part of our worship experience.

The Laity Session was called to order by Demetrio Beach, our conference Lay Leader. The session opened with praise and worship of our Lord Jesus Christ. Following praise and worship, there was an explanation of the new structure of the board of Lay Ministries - leading away from the focus on speaking to serving Our Lord in whatever way we are called. Lay servants are called to serve in many different capacities and this new structure honors the diversity of our spiritual gifts. An election was held to choose the next Conference Lay Leader to replace Betty Gooch. Demetrio Beach was elected. His first order of business was to announce that the District Lay Leaders were to become known as Associate Conference Lay Leaders since they all work together as a team. Following the election, Bible Study was led by Rev. Tori Butler from the Texas Annual Conference. Her emphasis was on the social and economic disparity within our conference and challenged the laity to listen to the concerns of those who did not look or sound the same as ourselves. Following the study, reports were given by the Lay Leaders of the Dover, Easton, Salisbury and Wilmington Districts. The laity session closed with worship and Holy Communion.

The afternoon session began with the clergy and laity meeting together in worship, which included liturgical dance and communion. The message was delivered by Rev. Dr. Shirlyn Henry Brown, who was appointed earlier in the year as Director of Connectional Ministry replacing Rev. Dr. Susan Steiner Ball. Dr. Henry Brown's message centered on our being disciples of Jesus Christ and being called to bring unity to God's world. A collection was taken for Volunteers in Mission-Disaster Relief. Holy conferencing began following the service. We heard a message from Dr. Bell President of UMES, welcoming us to their campus. We voted on four Constitutional Amendments made at the General Conference held in April of 2012. These amendments dealt with wording in the Book of Discipline and required only our acceptance or rejection of the amendments as presented. All four were accepted.

The teaching session held on Friday morning was led by Dr. David Anderson, founder and President of the Bridge Leadership Foundation and is founder and senior pastor of Bridgeway Community Church in Columbia MD that has nearly 3,000 attendees each week from 42 different nations. He has coined a new word: Gracism - a way of inclusion that "puts God in front of the problem of racism to get the power to work through it". As an African-American man married to a Korean-American woman, he had many amusing and heartbreaking anecdotes to share with us about dealing with racism and diversity in his own life. His discussion centered on four principles:

- 1. Comprehension begins with Conversation;
- 2. Openness leads to oneness;
- 3. <u>Multicolor does not multicultural make</u> inviting others in and expecting them to act and worship as we do does not signal acceptance;
- 4. Environment means everything almost welcome is a feeling.

As Dr. Anderson pointed out these four principles spell out COME Jesus message to all people.

Friday afternoon a service celebrating Ministry was held which honored all who have served in any area of ministry, including but not limited to: Pastors, Cabinet members, Ordained Elders, Ordained Deacons and the Ministry of the Laity. Those serving as pastors for five or more years (in five year intervals) were acknowledged. Several had served for more than 70 years. The service included presentation and general

examination of those being commissioned to provisional membership to the Order of Elder, and those admitted as Full Members and ordained as Elders.

Throughout the conference reports were given by the Committee on Clergy & Lay Leadership Team, the Advocacy Resource Team, the Christian Service Team, Conference Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry, Administrative Ministries, The Vision Team and the Commission on Archives and History.
