The Mary Martha Circle invites all ladies of the church to join us in Christian fellowship & lunch at our regular meetings on the first Wednesday of each month.


At **Noon** on **November 7**, we plan to lunch at Applebee's in the Ocean Outlets on Rt. 1, Rehoboth.

Dear Church Family and Friends,

Greetings in the name of the Lord our Savior! I hope this November newsletter finds you and your family well.

When I think of November, I think of several things: cooler weather (heating bills!), football, Punkin Chunkin, Taug fishing, All Saints Sunday, Thanksgiving and Advent. And this year, we have a national election that will determine the next President of the United States. (a reminder to vote on November 6<sup>th</sup>!) November also reminds me of a story in Acts that most likely takes place in the fall of the year, probably November. It's

the story of Paul's shipwreck (Acts 27) and not the best time of the year to take a sea journey in the Mediterranean Sea. I'd like to share a spiritual truth from that story.

The apostle Paul must face trial in Rome, so he is sent there by ship, under guard, along with 276 other passengers. Sometime during the journey, they encounter a massive storm at sea that lasts 2 weeks! The sea is relentless in its pounding of the ship. All hands are sick and the ship itself is in jeopardy of coming apart. They even start throwing overboard many provisions to help lighten the load so the ship can stay afloat. Yet Paul gives the passengers and crew hope. He tells them, "Men, you should have listened to me and not have set sail from Crete and incurred this injury and loss. Yet now I urge you to take heart, for there will be no loss of life among you, but only of the ship." (vs. 21) Indeed, the ship would run aground on a nearby island.

But even in the midst of a tumultuous storm, Paul encourages the people on board that ship, much like he encouraged his churches sitting in a prison cell, writing letters like the one to the Philippians. Paul told them that as long as they stayed with the ship, they would survive, even though the ship wouldn't. However, the ship had to be broken apart in order for the people to be saved. You see, the very ship that carried them had to be sacrificed in order to save them. It was pieces of the broken ship that enabled the people to reach shore. Pieces of the ship actually became their salvation.

This story helps us see that Jesus is our "ship" that had to be sacrificed to save us. When the storms of life come raging (i.e, chaos, tragedy, setbacks, adversity, etc) and we feel out of control, do we hang onto our piece of the ship, or try to go it on our own? Do we trust God's Word and stay with the ship, falling into the arms of the Lord who calmed the sea with his Word or try to stay in control in our own strength?

The next time you're in one of life's "storms," think about this story. Remember that the safest place to be was in the rough sea, bobbing up and down, but holding on to a piece of the ship. Why? Because even having a piece of the ship (Jesus) is better than anything else we can do to help save ourselves. This is called FAITH: "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for; the certainty of things unseen." (Heb. 11:1). This is called TRUST: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding." (Prov. 3:5).

Someday, I'm going to learn these things for myself. I'm a work in progress. I'm not where I want to be in my faith yet, but thank God I'm not where I used to be! God's still working on me!

# Stephen Ministry At Bethel

Stop, drop, and hold. That's what experts tell you to do when an earthquake hits. Sometimes, events rock our lives—death, divorce, illness, unemployment—as personal earthquakes. In the face of such earthquakes, Jesus tells us to "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

The name Stephen comes from the first layperson commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need (Acts 6). By walking alongside people during difficult times, Stephen Ministers help people endure their earthquakes while holding on to Christ.

Stephen Ministers are not counselors and should not be referred to as counselors. They are trained Christian caregivers. The Stephen Ministry is a supervised ministry. Their role is to listen and care—not counsel or advise. Stephen Ministers do not make cold calls. They are assigned only to people who agree to receive the care of a Stephen Minister. A Stephen Minister normally is assigned to only one care receiver at a time and typically meets with that person about an hour each week, although additional meetings may be appropriate in a time of crisis. Additionally, Stephen Ministers engage in twice-monthly supervision to ensure that they are providing the best-quality Christian care. Stephen Ministry is a confidential, gender-specific ministry. What a care receiver tells a Stephen Minister remains confidential. Even in supervision, the names of care receivers and specific details are never discussed.

Bethel United Methodist Church is one of more than 11,000 congregations enrolled in the Stephen Series. These congregations represent more than 160 difference Christian denominations and come from all 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces, and 24 other countries. More that 60,000 pastors, church staff, and laypeople have been trained as Stephen Leaders at Leader's Training Courses. These Stephen Ministers have, in turn, trained more than 500,000 congregation members to be Stephen Ministers. Since 1975, Stephen Ministers have provided distinctively Christian care to more than a million people in one-to-one Stephen Ministry skilled caring relationships touching the lives of millions of others in informal ways.

# Christmas Floral Workshop

Back by popular demand, there will be a workshop on Saturday, December 8<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m. until about 1:30 p.m. to make a Christmas Centerpiece of fresh evergreens from your yard or wherever you can find some. We will meet in the Parsonage Meeting House.

You bring the greens and Clippers to trim the branches to a suitable size. Fill a large plastic trash bag with whatever greens you can find. We put everyone's greens together to pick from so all participants will have a variety of greens in their own original creation.

A materials fee of \$10 will be Charged for floral container, floral foam, wide wired ribbon, tape, wire and picks used to create your centerpiece.

Greens suggested are White Pine, any short needled pine, Boxwood, English Ivy, Magnolia leaves, Euonymus, Juniper, Cedar, Yew etc. [Long needle pine that is real bushy is <u>not</u> suitable.] If you don't have evergreens in your yard, try places that sell Christmas trees to get the branches they trim off.

Optional: Silk flowers and a few glittery picks. Berry picks as well as long taper candles are a nice decorative touch. Pine Cones are also nice. I will have some decorations you can use but bring some if you like.

We will also make mini arrangements to give away. I will take them to a local nursing home or you can take your mini to someone who is ill or homebound.

Please help with clean up at the end of the workshop.
